From the Desk of Father James

Dear Parishioners,

Lent is halfway done and we are given two little breaks from Lenten penances this week. Wednesday is the Feast of St. Patrick, who is the patron of our diocese. Friday is the Solemnity of St. Joseph, who is the patron of the universal church. Both of these days are important feasts for us as Catholics and I encourage all to try to make it to mass on both of these days - but particularly on St. Joseph Day since the year 2021 is the year of St. Joseph. Also while Fridays in Lent are normally a day of abstinence from meat, there is an exception for solemnities which fall on a Friday, as the Solemnity of St. Joseph does. Therefore Catholics are not obligated to maintain the usual Lenten abstinence from meat this Friday, March 19. While it is laudable to want to continue penitential practices on this day, please keep in mind that it is a day of celebration as we celebrate St. Joseph, the spouse of the Blessed Mother and guardian of the Child Jesus. Here is the prayer that Pope Francis has encouraged us to say during the Year of St. Joseph:

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man. Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.


