From the Desk of Father James

Dear Parishioners,

We have come to the last week of the Easter season. The season of Easter is a length of 50 days. It begins on the day of resurrection and ends with the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. This time period, though symbolic, is also very literal. We know that Jesus spent 40 days with his disciples from his resurrection until his ascension to the Father (Acts 1:30) and that he sent his Holy Spirit to descend upon the Church ten days later on the Jewish feast of Shavuat (Acts 2:1-4), which we call Pentecost. But while we celebrate these special moments in God's plan of salvation, we know that his grace is not bound by calendars and dates - indeed God is constantly at work in our lives. St. John sums it up well when he says "Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book" (John 20:30). His presence and action in our lives continues every day, whether we realize it or not. Please remember to wear Red to celebrate the Feast. Also, I'd like to announce some very good news. Bishop Persico has declared that some of the COVID-19 protocols will be removed at the end of the month. Beginning May 29th all pews will be open and the exchange of peace will resume. Let's continue to pray for those who are ill (from any illness) and for families who have lost loved ones over the course of this past year.



OUR MINISTRY IN THE CHURCH

It is a seemingly small point, but one that is important to remember as we reflect on ministry during these days preceding the descent of the Spirit, to notice that the place of Judas among the apostles was refilled because of his betrayal, not because of his death. He was, according to Peter, "allotted a share in this ministry." It is, then, betrayal of the mission and not merely death that leaves a void in the fabric of the church's mission. We forget that in the minds of the other apostles, Judas still would have been numbered in the company of the Twelve when Jesus prayed the prayer we hear today: praying that, as they were sent into the world, they would be consecrated in the truth. It is difficult for us to comprehend that Jesus knelt to wash the feet of Judas. These are powerful and significant lessons for us to call to mind and keep in our hearts as we ponder the place of our particular ministry in the Church and the world, if we are remaining faithful to it, consecrated to the truth.
