From the Desk of Father James

Dear Parishioners,

Two weeks ago the Bishop held meetings with all of the priests of the Diocese at which he announced a few things. Much of the meeting was administrative and fairly boring. There was, however, one somewhat big announcement. Bishop Persico has decided to change the posture of the people during communion from standing to kneeling. He has determined that the people will kneel after the Lamb of God is sung. The people will stand as each pew comes up for communion. After returning from communion the people will resume kneeling.

As you experience when you travel, this is the practice of the vast majority of Dioceses in America. Our Diocese used to do communion like this, but we changed to our current practice in 2003. There were about a dozen or so other Dioceses that made the change with us. I suppose the Bishops thought it would catch on. One-by-one each diocese that had implemented this practice has changed back to the customary practice. Thus, with this change, we will be following the practice that is customary in most of our country.

This change is very providential. I had just begun to get bids for new padding in kneelers at St. Ann's Church. I think this is a sign that we need to go ahead with that project! This change also is meant to coincide with the national "Eucharistic Revival" in which we seek to deepen our appreciation of the Eucharist.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments- Bullying Prevention Month: Cyberbullying is bullying that takes place over digital devices like cell phones, computers, and tablets. Cyberbullying can occur through SMS, Text, and apps, or online in social media, forums, or gaming where people can view, participate in, or share content. Cyberbullying includes sending, posting, or sharing negative, harmful, false, or mean content about someone else. It can include sharing personal or private information about someone else causing embarrassment or humiliation. Some cyberbullying crosses the line into unlawful or criminal behavior. The most common places where cyberbullying occurs are: Social Media, such as Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, and Tik Tok; Text messaging and messaging apps on mobile or tablet devices; Instant messaging, direct messaging, and online chatting over the internet; Online forums, chat rooms, and message boards, such as Reddit; Email; and online gaming communities. Adults should take the same approach to address it: support the child being bullied, address the bullying behavior of a participant, and show children that cyberbullying is taken seriously. The Sound of Communion

The priest receives Holy Communion, and then there is movement, a bustle of activity, as we prepare to join the Communion procession. This holy meal does not happen in silence! Instead, we sing together even as we rise and move forward in procession to the altar. We must change and move to receive the Eucharist, and fittingly so, since the Eucharist is transformative—it demands action of us, internal as well as external. We do not receive the sacrament in silence, but with a dialogue that is also a profession of faith: "The Body of Christ." "Amen." "The Blood of Christ." "Amen." We acknowledge the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist with our "Amen" of faith, but more, our "Amen" is also a prayer that we may become what we receive, the Body of Christ, living and active in the world. 


