

From the Desk of Father James

Dear Parishioners.

Two weeks from now, the weekend of February 26th and 27th, is Commitment Sunday for the Catholic Services Appeal. The Catholic Services Appeal is an annual campaign which supports the work of the diocese and of the Bishop. We grudgingly pay taxes to civil authorities each year, knowing that they are often wasteful with our money. We ought, then, to be content to pay this sort-of tax to our ecclesiastical authority, knowing that they are a lot more frugal and financially conservative than the government. The amount raised by this campaign accounts for about 60 percent of the diocesan operating revenue. The budget is approved annually by the Diocesan Finance Council, which is a board composed primarily of lay men and women from our region who have experience in finance, accounting, or law. No funds donated to the Catholic Services Appeal have ever been or will be used to defrav expenses related to the sexual abuse crisis.

Each parish is assessed a certain amount, which is calculated as a percentage of the regular Sunday collection. Our parish assessment for this year is \$22,193. Any money which we raise above our assessment stays within the parish and is used toward larger projects. This year we will be using the money to reseal the parking lots of both churches and make improvements to both church organs. These projects are in addition to our iGiveCatholic projects, which include the roof on Stutz Hall and the kneelers at St. Ann's. Money raised beyond these projects will go toward the general operating expenses of our parish. The benefit of giving to the Catholic Services Appeal is that the money we raise does not count toward our regular Sunday collection, and thus it does not cause our future assessment to increase. May God bless you for your generosity.

PS. I will be away from February 16 to February 24. I always take a week-off before Lent each year. Fr. Phil Oriole will be covering the weekend masses next weekend.


