

# From the Desk of Father James

Dear Parishioners.

Last week I used this column to give a few thoughts on Lenten fasting, and I wrote that these thoughts on fasting would continue this week. Last week we discussed two of the reasons for Catholics to fast: (1) to develop a deeper sense of God and reliance on God, and (2) to strengthen our prayer. This week we will discuss reasons three, four, and five to include fasting into your Lenten routines.

A third reason that fasting can be beneficial is in prompting us to be more charitable. It has been an ancient custom of our faith that when we fast, we are expected to be generous with the money we save on food. Likewise, throughout the scriptures, God is constantly telling the Israelites to act charitably when then fast. While many people will tell you that they feel more ill-tempered and less charitable when they fast, I would argue that a slight change of attitude isn't difficult to do, and can open us up to God's grace in whole new ways. This is my thought: fasting is indeed difficult and one becomes grouchy if one is sitting around doing nothing; but if one is staying busy, one doesn't even think about it. Thus, if we wish to bear fasting well, we should stay active: and much of that activity can be dedicated to helping others. Therefore, fasting is intended to prompt us to do good works.

A fourth reason for fasting is thus: we learn that we don't actually need to eat as much as we do. Overeating is unhealthy, both to the body and to the spirit. Concerning the body: diet-related illnesses account for 38% of all deaths in America. Concerning the spirit: Pope Francis often refers to our excessive consumption as a corruption of our human nature. While fasting may seem difficult at first, if we give it a few days we will realize that we feel healthier, both physically and spiritually.

A fifth reason (and my favorite reason) for fasting: it makes Easter (and other celebrations) all the more joyful. If we do not fast, but are rather constantly over-consuming, we have nothing to look forward to. But if we fast, as recommended by millennia of tradition, those joyful days on which we feast become all the more joyful.

May we persevere in our Lenten commitments, and so come to a joyful celebration of the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.
