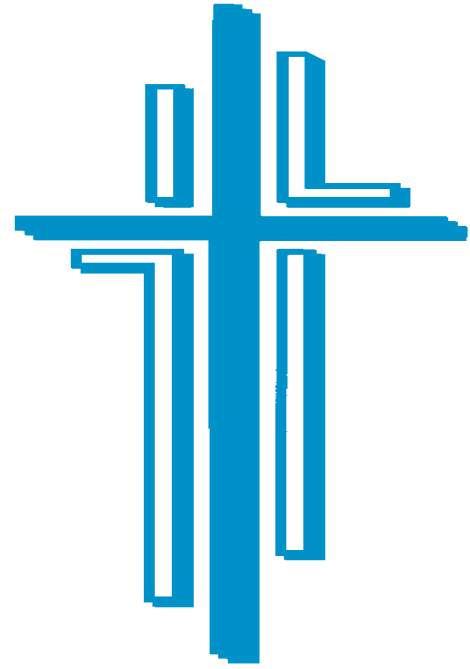

From the Desk of Father James

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday is the Fourth Sunday of Lent. It is the one Lenten Sunday with the liturgical color of rose rather than violet. It is called “Lætare Sunday” (pronounced lay-tar-ay). The name for this Sunday comes from the entrance antiphon of the mass, which begins “Lætáre, Jerúsalem: et convéntum fácite, omnes qui dilígitis eam” (Rejoice, Jerusalem, and come together, all you who love her). As we recognize that Easter is coming ever nearer, we rejoice on this Sunday that our Lenten sacrifices are almost at an end. This Sunday is meant to lift us up and strengthen us in our resolve to continue our penitential practices throughout these last three weeks of Lent.

You will be pleased to know that the arrangements have been made for Stutz Hall to get a new roof. We received three bids on the project: one for \$44,000, one for \$39,000, and one for \$36,000. After consultation with the finance council, I chose CJ Snyder Construction with their \$36,000 bid. Back in November we dedicated the iGiveCatholic campaign to this project (and to the kneelers at St. Ann’s). We raised \$27,909.90 in that campaign. While the roof is quite a bit more expensive than we thought it would be (the cost of metal has gone up), our parish is very generous and we will not have a problem meeting the difference.

Lastly, I would like to announce that I am painting the rectory. It’s been a lot more work than I thought it would be! I’m finished with the ceilings, the living room, and the dining room. I’m hoping to do the hallway and kitchen this week. I’m only doing the first floor right now. Once I finish with this, I’ll take a little break before I do the upper levels.
