

Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble. Psalm 91

From the Desk of Father James

Dear Parishioners,

I hope the first few days of Lent have been good for you so far. Remember that God already has graces prepared for us during this season, we need only be in the position to recognize them and receive them.

Keep in mind that the three disciplines of Lent are (1) prayer, (2) fasting, and (3) almsgiving. I would like to write a three- week series on these three topics. This week will be particularly on prayer.

Prayer can be defined several ways. Some refer to it as a "conversation" with God, others as a "relationship" with God. But lately I've been drawn to the definition of St. Theresa of Avila: "the ascent of the soul to God." It implies that we are embarking on a journey toward something great. It implies we must leave things behind, we will have difficulties along the way, and we have a destination. And St. Theresa warns us that the closer our souls get to God, the more inflamed with a desire for him they become. She describes God as a great hot light, and the closer we get, the more brilliantly we shine. On the other hand, when we do not pray, our souls are distant from this light, and are thus cold, and dark, and lifeless.

Prayer is <u>not</u> a mindless repetition of various phrases. It is something we must put our hearts into. I wholeheartedly recommend four particular options: weekday mass, daily rosary, stations of the cross, and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. In a particular way I am grateful for daily mass - it is the one biggest influence in my own spiritual journey. But whatever we choose to do, we must do it with our hearts - allowing our souls to approach the firmament of God's presence, to be filled with his light, and to crave him all the more.
