

#### From the Desk of Father James

#### Dear Parishioners,

A few weeks ago I wrote a column on the history of the Catholic Church in America. I wanted to continue that as a series, but it may have to wait another week.

Firstly, I would like to remind everyone to mark your calendars for Bishop Persico's visit to St. Mary's Church on Sunday, August 21, at the 8:30am Mass. According to the cannon law of the Catholic Church, a bishop is expected to visit every parish in his diocese every 5 years. These visits normally happen for celebrations of the Sacrament of Confirmation. I don't like having the bishop just come for confirmations, though, because regular parishioners may not feel like they are invited. Thus the bishop only gets to meet the families of the newly confirmed, and not the rest of the parish. Rather, I prefer to invite the bishop to come for a regular weekend Mass. That way, everyone feels like they can come and meet him.

Last year we hosted the bishop at St. Ann Church for a Saturday evening Mass. It turned out to be a great celebration. He will be celebrating the 8:30am Mass on Sunday, August, 21. The Mass will be followed by coffee and doughnuts in Stutz Hall. Stutz Hall is not air conditioned, but it stays fairly cool. Nevertheless, let us pray that it isn't too hot that weekend.

Secondly, I would like to thank everyone for buying and selling the July Lottery tickets this year. Our parish is dependent on our annual fund-raisers. Your generosity is greatly appreciated.

Thirdly, let us continue to pray for our nation in the wake of the most recent shooting. Jesus Christ alone can give us the peace we desire. May he bless our nation with that peace.

In his parable about the good Samaritan, Jesus explains how the law of love overrules the letter of the law. Instead of answering the question "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus demonstrates that it is not about who is worthy of being loved, but rather loving as God loves-about being neighbor, about being the good Samaritan. 
