From the Desk of Father James

Dear Parishioners,

Happy New Year! The Year of Our Lord 2022 is behind us and the Year of Our Lord 2023 is ahead of us. I pray that you may enjoy plenty of pork and sauerkraut and that you may have a blessed year.

It is customary to make resolutions for the New Year. The fresh start is a good opportunity to get back on track, particularly with health. This is also a prime opportunity to get back on track with our spiritual health! If I were to make one recommendation for a new year's resolution, it would be this: pray the rosary every day! The rosary was given by the Blessed Mother to St. Dominic as an easy and meditative prayer for us to pray. The Blessed Mother has continually requested we pray it, as at Lourdes and at Fatima. Through the rosary, our parish should be a powerhouse of prayer that transforms our families and our community.

Through the rosary, we spend time honoring Jesus and meditating on his life through the eyes of the person who loved him most, his mother. The rosary is a very adaptable prayer: it can be said in the car while we drive, at work or home while doing chores, or, if we have a little more time, very slowly and deliberately.

A few weeks ago, the TV program 60 Minutes presented a piece on the most recent miracle from Lourdes: the healing of a nun who suffered for many years from a painful and debilitating condition. Sister Bernadette Moriau, after a visit to Lourdes, experienced a scientifically inexplicable recovery. These are the things that happen when we stay close to the Blessed Mother. I do not know what miracles God has in store for us this year, but I am certain that he has something special planned.

Know the Warning Signs of a Predator: Perpetrators are not waiting on the street to snatch kids; only 10% of sexually abused children are abused by strangers. 90% are abused by someone known and trusted by the child/child's family. Perpetrators integrate themselves into everyone's life, not just the child. They build relationships so that they are trusted to be alone with the child. One of the most important ways to ensure the safety of children in our environments is to know the warning signs of adults who present a risk of harm to children. Among these signs are when the person (1) always wants to be alone with a child in areas where no one can monitor the interactions, (2) allows a child to do things their parents would not permit, (3) is always more excited to be with children than with adults, and (4) discourages others from participating in activities involving kids.

REPORTING EMAIL/PHONE SCAMS

Online criminals will often search church bulletins to look for email addresses and phone numbers of potential victims. They will then create an email account with which they will fraudulently impersonate the pastor of the church or some other church employee. If you get an email or text from someone claiming to be Fr. James or another representative of the parish, and that email or text asks for gift cards or personal information, please forward it to Fr. BLESSINGS


Today's readings include another account of the story of Jesus' birth. The reading from the book of Numbers reminds us that we are blessed. We are looked upon with kindness and grace. The psalm and Galatians remind us of the blessings given through God's Son. Luke tells of our ultimate blessing, that Mary, a human being like us, gave birth to a child who is God's Son. Mary, a young mother, watches all that is happening around the birth of her son. She listens as the shepherds bring messages from angels, a message she also received from an angel, about her son.
