From the Desk of Father James

Dear Parishioners.

Next weekend is Commitment Sunday for the Catholic Services Appeal. The Catholic Services appeal is the annual campaign to support the work of the Diocese of Erie. The amount raised by this campaign accounts for about 60 percent of the diocesan operating revenue. The diocesan budget is approved annually by the Diocesan Finance Council, which is a board composed primarily of lay men and women from our region who have experience in finance, accounting, or law. No funds donated to the Catholic Services Appeal have ever been or will ever be used to defray expenses related to the sexual abuse crisis.

Each parish is assessed a certain amount, which is calculated as a percentage of the regular Sunday collection. Our parish assessment for this year is \$23,529. Any money which we raise above our assessment stays within the parish and is used toward larger projects. This year we will be using the money to install a new confessional in St. Mary's Church and to replace and reconfigure the locks in St. Mary's Church, Stutz Hall, and the rectory. These projects are in addition to our iGiveCathoic project and January lottery project, which were recarpeting Stutz Hall and making the bathrooms of Stutz Hall handicap accessible. Money raised beyond these projects will go toward the general operating expenses of our parish. The benefit of giving to the Catholic Services Appeal is that the money we raise does not count toward our regular Sunday collection, and thus it does not cause our future assessment to increase. May God bless you for your generosity.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments-Bystanders can help.

Bystanders can play a big role in stopping bullying. When people do nothing, it sends a message that it's no big deal to bully. If people say something, it sends a social message that bullying is not OK. If you see someone being bullied, you can help by doing these things: *Speak up to help*: If it feels safe and natural to speak up, say, "come on, let's get out of here" to the person being bullied. It is okay to let the bully know people are watching and will get involved. *Report it*: Let a trusted adult know what you witnessed. This isn't tattling, it is standing up for what's right. *Offer support*: Check in with the person who was being bullied. Ask how they are doing. Remind them that the bullying is not their fault. Online criminals will often search church bulletins to look for email addresses and phone numbers of potential victims. They will then create an email account with which they will fraudulently impersonate the pastor of the church or some other church employee. If you get an email or text from someone claiming to be Fr. James or another representative of the parish, and that email or text asks for gift cards or personal information, please forward it to Fr. OUR FASCINATING FAITH

The Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order

On February 17 we honor the seven founding saints of the Order of the Servants of the Virgin Mary. Bonfilius, Alexis, Manettus, Amideus, Hugh, Sostene and Buonagiunta were a group of merchants of Florence who, upon experiencing an apparition of the Blessed Virgin in 1233, renounced their businesses, left what was necessary for their families, and distributed the rest among the poor. They then dedicated themselves entirely to the veneration of the Virgin Mary, going to live on an Italian mountain, each assuming the life of a hermit—prayer, extreme fasting and penance. Sometime later, at the request of the pope's delegate, all but one were ordained priests. Brother Alexis, considering himself unworthy of the priesthood, decided to remain as a brother. They were all canonized in 1888. Their feast day, originally February 11, now falls on the 17th, the date of the death of the last of the seven founders. Brother Alexis died at the age of 110.

THE GLORY OF THE DIVINE WAY

Today's readings draw us into ageless, vibrant depths. Followers of God's law, we belong to ancient traditions. Children of God, we marvel at the freshness of creation. The Old Testament readings, from Sirach and the Psalms, celebrate the rich blessings we receive when we observe God's commands—not because we are slaves to the law, but because the law gives life in abundance. Saint Paul's Letter to the Corinthians confirms the glory of divine law, but warns that God's ways tend to be unpopular and misunderstood in this world. Paul speaks of the ancient wisdom of God, which is mysteriously both "hidden" and "revealed." God does not have secret codes that we earthly mortals cannot understand; in love, God reveals the glory of the divine way in Jesus.
