# From the Desk of Father James

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday is the Fourth Sunday of Lent. It is the one Lenten Sunday with the liturgical color of rose rather than violet. It is called "Lætare Sunday" (pronounced lay-TAR-ay). The name for this Sunday comes from the entrance antiphon of the mass, which begins "Lætáre, Jerúsalem: et convéntum fácite, omnes qui dilígitis eam" (Rejoice, Jerusalem, and come together, all you who love her). As we recognize that Easter is coming ever nearer, we rejoice on this Sunday that our Lenten sacrifices are almost at an end. This Sunday is meant to lift us up and strengthen us in our resolve to continue our penitential practices throughout these last three weeks of Lent.

You will be pleased to know that the work on Stutz Hall almost been completed. The bathrooms have been modified to accommodate those who use wheelchairs and the walls have been painted. Now we just need the new carpet to be installed. It is scheduled to go in this week. You may have noticed in the bulletin that we are having a Spring Cleaning Day in Stutz Hall on Saturday April 1 at 9:00 a.m. All are invited to help make our hall look like new.

Lastly, I would like to remind everyone to make it to confession. There is a penance service today (Sunday, March 19) at Immaculate Conception Church in Clarion at 3:00pm. There is another one at St. Patrick's Church in Franklin next Sunday at 3:00 p.m. Ours is at St. Mary's Church on Monday, March 27, at 7:00 p.m. Alternatively, I will be hearing confessions for extra hours during Holy Week.

#### **CRS RICE BOWL**



#### OUR FASCINATING FAITH

#### The Three Lenten Disciplines: Fasting

The season of Lent is characterized by fasting and abstinence. I remember that when I was a child, my parents instilled in me the practice of giving up eating sweets and abstaining from candy during Lent so I could share the bitterness of the suffering that Jesus endured for my sins. Eventually in our parish, the priest encouraged us to put aside the money saved from not buying candies in order to send it to poor children. Fasting and abstinence were not only ways to accompany Jesus in his suffering on the cross, but also means of encouraging and consoling him in his suffering children of today's world. The pastor taught me that fasting is not simply refraining from sweets and candy; fasting teaches me how to deny myself so that it is not I who live but Christ who lives in me. To fast means to deny myself certain things in order to give life to others, and thus, with my small sacrifice, to make the world a little better.




