From the Desk of Father James

Dear Parishioners,

On Wednesday, June 14, I had a conversation with Bishop Persico and he gave me some news to share. I announced the news at Masses last weekend and I wanted to include it in the bulletin this weekend.

First, the bishop has announced that our parish will be partnered with St. Joseph Parish in Lucinda and St. Michael Parish in Fryburg. A "partnered parish" is one which remains a distinct and separate parish but shares a pastor. Partnered parishes are also expected to have a combined office and a combined pastoral council. Partnered parishes, however, keep their own separate finance councils. The pastor of these three parishes will be Fr. Michael Polineck.

Second, the bishop has announced that our new parish grouping will be assigned a "parochial vicar" (assistant priest). Our new parochial vicar will be Fr. Cory Pius, who was just ordained a priest four weeks ago. I have known Fr. Pius since he entered seminary six years ago and I am very happy that he is being appointed to our parishes.

Third, the bishop has announced that I will become the pastor of St. Joseph Parish in Sharon, PA. All of these changes are scheduled to go into effect on Tuesday July 11.

As part of this transition, the following changes will be made: Mass schedules will be altered so that, in the case of an emergency, one priest would be able to do all the Masses if he had to; parish offices will be combined. Also, the bishop wants the two priests to live in the same rectory. For the time being, they will live in the rectory at St. Joseph's Church.

In summary, Fr. Michael Polineck will be the pastor of our combined grouping of parishes and Fr. Corey Pius will be the parochial vicar for our combined grouping of parishes. I have been asked to serve as pastor of St. Joseph Church in Sharon. These changes go into effect on Tuesday July 11.

Personally, I have had 3 wonderful years here. And while 3 years is far too short a time to spend here, this is what I happily gave my life for: to go where I was sent, and hopefully, to glorify God throughout. I cannot thank all of you enough for all the support you have shown me over these three years.
